35. SWOC analysis of the department and Future plans  
(Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities & Challenges)

**Strengths –**

1. Regular classes are well-carried out for the students in Major and Pass course.
2. Active interaction during and beyond class-room teaching.
3. Departmental Counseling is provided both by teachers and experts as and when necessary.
4. Extending teaching services for skill based course in “Teaching in elementary level”
5. Success of students in TET (Teacher Eligibility Test) before achieving graduation for obtaining jobs in LP and High Schools.
6. Seminars, group discussions are held on lively topics

**Weaknesses--**

1. Insufficient Laboratory equipments
2. Inadequacy of infrastructure facilities like black board, fan, ventilation, electricity etc.
3. Lack of a teacher educator for the Skill based Course.
4. No micro teaching lab and apparatus for recording the classes of micro teaching.
5. No separate provision (laboratory room) for conducting “Psychological Practical”.

**Opportunities ---**

1. To arrange Departmental Parent-Teacher meet.
2. To invite eminent academicians for scholarly discussion.
3. Possibility of introducing allied courses on education subjected to permission and other formalities from the relevant authority.

**Challenges ---**

1. In spite of high ratio between the teacher and students in Education Pass Course classes and evaluation are carried out smoothly.
2. In spite of faculty-shortage for Skill-Based courses, both theory and practical classes are conducted regularly.
3. Absence of a model school creates problem for “Teaching-Practical”, however such practical classes are conducted in a local school, twice a year and supervised by the faculty with full care and attention.

**Future plan---**

1. To introduce post- graduate course in Education under Distance Education of Dibrugarh University.
2. To organize inter- disciplinary programmes such as Seminars, Talks, Workshops etc.
